

# A Dana at Home

- Offering Dana to monks is a meritorious deed.
- We offer Dana in memory of departed parents to celebrate a birthday or as an annual event.
- This is also known as Sanghika Dana.

❖ Please get a printout and paste it into the book.

- The things we have to do in preparation are,
- 1. First fix a date and invite the chief monk of the nearby temple.
- 2. Decide on the number of monks to be invited.
- 3. Meet the chief monk and offer a sheaf of betel and arrange a date.
- 4. Clean the house and compound.
- 5. Buy the necessary things including Atapirikara( gifts to the monks).
- 6. Items necessary to cook the Dana has to be listed and collected a few days ahead.
- 7. Food has to be prepared for the monks and the guests.
- 8. All tables and chairs should be covered with a white cloth.
- 9. A table is kept to place all food items and Pririkara to be offered to the monks.
- 10.A special table is arranged to place the Casket of relics brought from the temple and offerings in the name of the Buddha are placed there.
- 11.A basin is kept at the entrance of the house to wash the feet of the monks when they arrive.
- 12.A tray of betel is kept ready to offer to the chief monk when inviting to start the ceremony.
