May & Might

"May" is used to ask permission

Eg:

- 1. May I drink some water, please?
- 2. May I borrow your pen, please?
- 3. May I switch on the fan, please?

"May" is also used to suggest that something is possible or predict something Eg:

- 1. It may rain later today.
- 2. Peter may come to school today.
- 3. She may go home early.

may + base-verb

"May" is used to make a wish

Eg:

- 1. May all your dreams come true!
- 2. May the Noble Triple Gem bless you!
- 3. May this year bring you happiness and health!

"Might" is used when we are not sure about something.

Eg:

- 1. I might see you tomorrow.
- 2. My father might go to Canada next week.
- 3. The children might behave well in the classroom.

might + base-verb

Let's make negative sentences with 'may' and 'might'

$$may + not$$

$$might + not$$

Eg:

- 1. You may not throw rubbish on the floor.
- 2. The children may not come to school during pandemic time.
- 3. They might not come home early.
- 4. It might not catch the bird.
