

Some rules and regulations to be observed when travelling about.

- 1. Drivers should drive the vehicles on the left side of the road.
- 2. At a roundabout, the vehicles on the right side have the right of way.
- 3. In hilly areas, always give room for the vehicle climbing up the hill.
- 4. Should always be aware of the safety of passengers when driving a vehicle.
- 5. On the highway the vehicles that are going slow should go on the left lane allowing the vehicles going fast to travel without any hindrance.
- 6. Help those people who are disabled to cross the road.
- 7. When travelling in public transport vehicles get up and give the seats allocated to different sections. eg. religious leaders, pregnant women, disabled people.

The light signals are used to guide people when travelling.





- 2. Computers, Google maps


